Following World War II, Protestant churches in the U.S. appealed for relief and reconstruction of devastated areas, primarily in Europe & Asia. A program called "One Great Hour" broadcast on March 26, 1949, closed with a request that listeners attend their local church and make a sacrificial contribution. It was estimated that more than 75,000 churches worldwide participated. The next year, the offering was repeated, using the name "One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS)." Over the past 74 years, OGHS has provided Presbyterians a way to share God's love with our neighbors in need around the world.
