Genesis 2:15-23








Fifth Reading: Mary delivers God's Promise




Sixth Reading: God reveals hope for the whole world

With the prophets Isaiah and Jeremiah, we watch and wait for the coming of Christ who will bring light and peace to all the world.


With John the Baptist, we cry out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord! Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near."


