The Dodekah Ministry Launches a New Program this August!

The Dodekah Ministry began with an idea in 2018. "How can we dig deeper for the people who have been there, done that?" The idea of intentional relationship building, Bible reading, and breaking bread together bloomed into the Dodekah Ministry, a Biblical Greek word that means twelve.

The main premise of Dodekah is that for 12 months, 12 people will eat together, study together, fundraise together, and then explore the world together.

In 2018-2019, Eight members pursued a program that incorporated the Covenant Bible Study, fundraising, and a planned trip to Israel—hopes were dashed when COVID hit and the world shut down.

In August, eleven FPC members will begin a new Dodekah Program with their eyes set to the Presbyterian Church's home, Scotland!

In this program, participants will learn about Scotland's history with an eye on the Reformation, read Robert Burn's poetry, study Presbyterian theology, and finally, in May 2023, travel to Scotland for two weeks.

How to Be a Generosity Builder

"And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?" Luke 12:20

A member of the Presbyterian Foundation once wrote: "On a spring morning, I saw a large Red-tailed Hawk fly overhead carrying a long heavy stick. Non-migratory birds of my area were beginning to build nests. During the months to come, birds of all kinds would pour extraordinary effort, time, and ingenuity to the construction of nests, the protection of eggs, and the feeding of their vulnerable young ones. After the little ones hatch, I'm always amazed at the unceasing care offered by the parents. Every ounce of the adults' energy is devoted, not to their own comfort and feeding, but to the survival of their young.

The notion of building nests is often used as a metaphor to describe people successfully providing for their own comforts. When we are comfortable, secure, and feel at home in our workplace or living area, we talk about the space being "our own little nest." The word nest often connotes shelter, coziness, homelike, comfortable.

Now consider "nests" we build in our churches. Does our giving serve us and our needs or serve God by serving the mission of the church to reach new people? Those new to the faith are as vulnerable as hatchlings and require a steady and dedicated effort of feeding."

For those who practice generosity, the nests we build are not for ourselves – they are for the next generation, those new to the faith, the future of the body of Christ. Establishing funds within the FPC endowment through your estate plan is one way of showing that you care about the future of our church. Endowed funds can be set up in our church for continued current giving now or after death, scholarships, local or global missions, property maintenance, and gifts to enrich church programs.

Jane Cranston, Reconciliation Ministry



Session Meeting Highlights of July 2022

The session met July 19, 2022 on Zoom. Pastor Kyle Otterbein called the meeting to order and declared a quorum. Elder Jane Cranston offered devotions and prayer.

Session discussed a report submitted by the Pastor Nominating Committee, followed by a discussion of a Personnel Committee's report.

A motion was approved to support the Congregational Health Ministry's request to organize an FPC team to support the "Walk to End Alzheimer's" fund raiser on September 18, 2022, which will be held at City Park.

Reconciliation committee announced that Pakistan Education board's Veda Gill will be visiting FPC September 11–18, 2022.

Worship and Arts committee presented two **motions that were approved**. First, that Session accept the bid from Patrick Budelier Pipe Organ Services, LLC at an estimated cost of \$47,078 to repair the electronics of the Phelps Organ. Second, that Session authorize a focused fund-raising campaign to secure the funds needed over and above those that are available in the

Organ Reserve-Repair Fund and the operating budget and whatever can be gleaned out of the Endowment fund according to the rules, to make the repairs to the Phelps Organ. Both motions were approved.

It was noted that Toni Thompson (daughter of Duane and Sue Thompson) was inurned in the FPC columbarium on June 30, 2022.

There were two deaths noted in July: Jack Perkins died on July 2, 2022. The funeral was held July 11, 2022 at Lensing's Funeral Home. Nancy Powers died on July 5, 2022. A family committal will be held on September 4 at the FPC columbarium by Rev. Gary L. Burnett

Closing prayer was offered by Elder Lara Marsh.

Don't know where the AED cabinet is? Take a few moments to locate the cabinet. It could mean the difference between life and death.


