Beginning February 13, First Presbyterian Church will host an art installation by local artist India Johnson. The piece will be up as we walk through a Lent that will mark 2 years of the COVID-19 pandemic. India will also speak during worship about her art on Sunday, February 13.

India Johnson (b. 1992) is an Iowa City-based artist who makes sculptures, installations, and participatory projects for churches and libraries. Her work associates textiles with formal practices for organizing information. Conceptually, she is interested in meaningful repetition, the spatial nature of reading, and sacred books and texts. India holds an MFA from the University of Iowa Center for the Book.

About the work:

Title: DEMAND / PRAYER

Date: 08 March 2020 - 07 March 2021

Media: Ink on muslin, cotton thread, hand and machine piecing

Description: DEMAND / PRAYER documents the first year of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Johnson County, Iowa. A county is the smallest geographic unit for which

case data is available.

The number of times that the phrase "FROM PLAGUE DELIVER US" is stamped on a square indicates the number of new cases that day. This phrase originates in a call-and-response section in The Book of Common Prayer called the Litany. Initially compiled during the Black Death, The Book of Common Prayer is still the source of most of the language used in Christian funerals and last rites.




How FPC is Supporting Black Entrepreneurs: An Update on Rachael Scott

In February 2020, FPC'S REALM Committee provided the opportunity for two Black entrepreneurs, Rachael Scott and Pastor Theogene Havugimana, to attend the University of Iowa Venture School. This was part of the church's focus on racial reconciliation, especially in the domain of financial resources. Both Rachael and Pastor Theo were thrilled to be participants. Rachael has dreamed of owning her own mobile coffee truck, while Pastor Theo is creating a farming enterprise to provide African vegetables in this region of the state. FPC arranged for each to have a supportive team of people that would accompany them on this journey of becoming a business entrepreneur. (Special thanks to FPC's Stephanie Brentner, who was a member on Rachael's team.)



Rachael and Pastor Theo each presented their "pitch" to communicate their business plan and other information that encouraged the audience to support their idea.



Nancy: How did the Venture School and Shark Tank events help you with your business idea?

Rachael: Both helped me greatly. Venture School gave me the foundation and fundamentals of running a business and understanding more about marketing. And Shark Tank gave me the rest of the capital I needed to purchase the concession trailer that I have. Members of FPC helped in general by taking my survey and being interviewed to understand the need for such a business as mine in this area. FPC team member Stephanie(Brentner) helped me stay focused and provided me with the extra help I needed in areas especially with writing during Venture School. The FPC support with the weekly calls, and Lara (Marsh) with her expertise in Venture School. Overall, you all were a blessing and a great amount of help.

Nancy: Where are you now? How is it going?

Rachael: I'm in a great space, I have a few contracts lined up to provide coffee and pastries at area businesses. I'll be serving



coffee at a kiosk in some new office spaces opening in Pepperwood Plaza, and some other contracts in the making. I'm doing events and expos. I've been invited to participate in the Black Business Expo at the University of Iowa in January. I was recently on the panel of speakers at the Women Entrepreneurs luncheon.

I completed an entrepreneurial cohort program at the Multicultural Development Center In Iowa City, and a marketing cohort program through the Jane Boyd Center in Cedar Rapids. My trailer is structurally ready and needs some finishing touches. I'm now adding things such as decals. I'm making contacts to get the equipment purchased and installed. I participated in a Kiva entrepreneurial online loan program that is funding proper storage of the trailer and equipment.

Nancy: What lies ahead for you?

Rachael: I am working with the South District of Iowa City and the City of Iowa City to participate in the special events that take place in this area. I'm also scheduled to be a regular at the Iowa City Farmers Market. My website is up and running, which allows for additional customer service. This is the beginning that will hopefully lead to another truck in the future along with my purchase of Cafe del Sol. Again, I'm so grateful to FPC; I would not have completed this without your help and generosity. It would only have been my dream, but you all made it possible.

The Church Re-Entry Committee has updated the Phase III policy to correspond with current COVID-19 information. In response to the increase in COVID numbers, the Session voted on January 10 to require masks

to be worn during all church activities, preferably KN95 masks. The revised policy can be found on



the Open Information window on the church website. Announcements will also be made during the church service. Ryerson Hall will be open for conversation after the service. We are excited to offer both in-person and online worship. By following these Phase III guidelines, we can work together to keep us all healthy!

During this time of transition before we welcome our called pastor, Session voted to retain the services of an office administrator. I was happy to accept this call and have been working in the church office since November 22. I'm hoping that my experience in school administration will allow me to support the work of the staff and maintain consistency of programming during this interim period. These past weeks have been an absolute joy, and I appreciate the help staff and others are providing as I step into this new position.


The Jeremiah Justice Initiative is starting a new adventure: Fiction!




