Dear Members and Friends,

I've met "new" people the past ten days. Tammy, Anna, Judy, Bill, John, Dwight, Flint, Herb, Susan, Leah, Brian, Janice, Jack, Nancy, Tammy, Jesse, Israel, and Doris. Each one had ears, a chin, jaw, arms, legs, clothes, smiles, curiosity, and expressions of surprise at their interim pastor: utterly handsome, slender and young! And each of them was delightful beyond expectations. We'll come down to earth one of these days, but each mask-less opportunity feels like a revelation. "Oh, that's what you look like!"

What I've learned during this pandemic and now seeing people face-to-face is that, as dedicated as everyone has been trying to make the phone/email/ Zoom triad work, it isn't as complete as the informal and meaningful communication that take place while talking face-to-face. I am grateful to all for making this challenging lockdown journey work as well as it has.

When are we going to worship together in the building? I'm only one voice in that conversation. For a long time, I didn't think I would meet you face-to-face before a new pastor arrived. Now I cannot imagine us not opening before I leave.

I rejoice that so many of you have received the vaccine. I am concerned that it now seems the burden of Covid infection is falling more and more to younger people. I'm concerned, too, about the health impact



and possibility of a rising rate of infection when students return to the university. The re-entry committee that advises Session has met a lot, listens to your feedback, monitors health resources, and wants to open as soon as possible. The committee will keep you informed.

Session formed a Self-Study Committee in May and the committee hopes to complete its work this month. Many of you participated in the self-study survey on June 6. A self-study is one of the preliminary steps before a congregation forms its Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). As soon as the self-study is completed, its report will go to Session for approval and you will be kept up to date.

The day is coming when we'll gather face-to-face in worship and, hopefully, not long after that day we hope to be singing together again.

What's New in June at FPC?

We have recently seen hopeful signs that pandemic conditions in Johnson County are becoming safer and that our community is beginning to transition back to more normal activities. As a first step in that transition, First Presbyterian Church will begin Phase 2 of our reentry plan on June 1. Our goal is to begin to allow smaller inperson activities in the church in a way that is safe and allows opportunity for all members to participate.

What does that mean for our congregation?

- Small groups will be allowed to hold activities in the church.
 - Social distancing, masking, and cleaning requirements must be observed to ensure the safety of all participants. See the detailed policies in the COVID 19 Response section of the FPC website.
 - Activities will be limited to the sanctuary, Ryerson Hall, and Coover Lounge. Contact the office to reserve these spaces.
 - Members do not need to be fully vaccinated to participate.
 - Activity organizers are encouraged to offer online options for people who are unable or are uncomfortable participating in-person.
- Worship services will remain 100% online for now. Session is making plans for the resumption of inperson worship services when it is safe to do so and all preparations can be completed.
- Session will continue to monitor the pandemic conditions in Johnson County to determine when it is safe to resume in-person worship and larger gatherings. If conditions worsen, FPC may be required to go back to all online activities.

Assistance Needed with FPC Grounds

The Buildings and Grounds Committee is once again coming to grips with the enormity of trying to manage our grounds. To this end, we're convening a "Grounds Taskforce" to initiate a comprehensive plan for grounds restoration and maintenance. Our initial meeting will be held on Monday, July 28, at 5–6 p.m. via Zoom for convenience.

Ultimately, a team of volunteers will be needed to assist with restoration and maintenance activities. We'd like to take this opportunity to thank the following individuals who've worked on some of these activities to date. Dave Carlson performed initial work on the Bell Garden; Gerald Hill initiated restoration of the garden at the lower entry; Sue VanDuyn rejuvenated the planters at the main entrance; Tammy Schroeder is following up with Quality Care on the need to replace two shrubs in columbarium circle under warranty. Further, as reported in the May/June newsletter, eight FPC members participated in a successful outdoor clean-up event on May 1.

It is anticipated that additional volunteers will be needed for ongoing maintenance of the Bell Garden, lower entryway garden, planters at the entryway, shrubs and small trees, various flower and groundcover beds, the labyrinth garden, and water collection system for the labyrinth garden. 

Anna Sheetz on Maternity Leave this Summer



First things first ... You need to sign into My First Pres; it is a portal on the website that lets you update your contact info, add a family photo, see your financial gifts, set up online giving, print directories, and view the church calendar. Instruction to sign in, below in green box.

Sign in to My First Pres

- 1. Go to FPC website, https://firstpresiowacity.org/, scroll down to the My First Pres box
- 2. Click on "Need a Login? Click Here"
- 3. You will be asked to enter your first name, last name and email. Enter this info and click "Find Me"
- 4. You should see a note congratulating you on setting up your account.
- 5. Once you see that note, check your email for your username and temporary password
- 6. You will be able to change password once you login
- 7. You should open up to the HOME screen; look at MY COMPLETE PROFILE for your personal information, PLEASE make sure your address and phone numbers are correct, feel free to make any changes needed. Note: changes are verified and may take 24 hours to show up. You can also sign up for online giving, pledging and see your yearly giving.

This is where it gets handy ... Now that you have My First Pres set up, you have the option to download the Church Life app to your phone or tablet! Church Life keeps you organized by allowing you to see calendar events, locate your friends' contact info (church directory at your finger tips); text, email and call plus get directions to map visits all on the go. You can keep track of your pledge and gifts to FPC, too.
