

Consultation's Corner

FPC is a founding member of the Consultation of Religious Communities (CRC), a local network of faith communities, social service agencies, and advocacy groups. The CRC promotes interfaith dialogue, social justice, community service and dignity for all. The CRC's "Common Fund" provides over \$35,000 in annual funding to CommUnity Crisis Services' "Emergency Assistance Program" for rent and utility assistance in Johnson County. Donations may be made at https://builtbycommunity.org/donate/ (Make sure to note "For Common Fund" in the comments section). CRC meetings at 10–11 a.m. on the 3rd Wednesday of each month include an interactive education program.

The April program on lowa City's *Table to Table* was presented by Nicki Ross. One of the largest direct food rescueto-distribution organizations in the U.S., last year *Table* to *Table* saved more than 2 million pounds of usable food with an estimated value of over \$6 million. UAY's mission is to nurture the potential for all youth to create, grow, and succeed as young people in a safe and healthy community. With a main location at 1700 S. 1st Avenue, there is a Youth Center at 355 lowa Ave.

Session Meeting Highlights of May 2022

The session met May 17, 2022 on Zoom and at FPC. Pastor Jennifer Jennings called the meeting to order and declared a quorum. Elder Jane Cranston led with devotions and prayer.

Session welcomed FPC member Tom Martin via Zoom who offered a number of concerns having to do with loss of membership, finances, and transparency in the hiring of a new pastor. Elder John Barr will reach out to Tom Martin on behalf of Session and thank him for his time and comments.

A motion was approved from the Capital Campaign Implementation Taskforce (CCIT) to decommission the CCIT and its Technology Subcommittee.

A motion was presented and approved that Session accepts and endorses the analysis and recommendations for action of the Session Taskforce's second report. The taskforce has identified key concerns and recommended actions that FPC needs to begin addressing immediately as it strives to remain a viable faith community in lowa City.

Elder Dave Van Dusseldorp spoke about the Endowment Committee's request for approval of disbursement of funds. A need to further examine the report items was expressed, and a motion to table the motion to approve the Endowment requests until a called Session meeting on Tuesday, May 24, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. could be convened to further discuss the report was approved. At the May 24 meeting, the motion to accept the Endowment Committee's disbursement of endowment proceeds was approved. The disbursement is as follows:

 \$1,750 to Anna Sheetz for remaining seminary level class: "The Polity and Program of the Presbyterian Church."

- 2. Up to \$8,000 to Dodekah Ministry for \$1,000 support per new participant
 - participant toward Capstone study trip.
- \$6,000 to Enihakole Ministries for initial six months' rent for a new ministry working in support of African immigrants in eastern lowa and communities in eastern Africa.
- \$10,000 to Domestic Violence Intervention Program (local social services organization) toward a threeyear pledge of \$25,000 (\$10,000 + \$10,000 + \$5,000) for the \$6,000,000 capital campaign "Finding Safety, Building Hope."

The Congregational Health Ministries team would like to expand the "core team" for the Kindness Campaign in September 2022. They are seeking volunteers from Session to join them in the planning and implementation process. Elder Lara Marsh is helping CHM with the logo and printable materials.

Elder John Barr reported on the opportunity to support a Presbyterian Hunger Project grant to our local Catholic Worker House. **Session approved a motion** to convey their support and John wrote a letter of support as a representative of the FPC session.

Committees were encouraged to submit their proposed line-item budgets and corresponding narratives to acting administrator Nancy Gardner by Friday, August 26, 2022.

Closing prayer was offered by Elder Dave Van Dusseldorp.

When you empty the lint trap as you are doing your laundry say a quick prayer:


"God, help me remove the junk in my life that is keeping me away from you."

Quick, short sentences are okay! For example: "God, please be with the Smiths as they wait for their new baby to arrive and







The Difficult Words of Jesus Book Study

Summer 2022

Jesus provided his disciples teachings for how to follow the Torah, God's Word; he told them parables to help them discern questions of ethics and of human nature; he offered them beatitudes for comfort and encouragement. But sometimes Jesus spoke words that followers then and now have found difficult. He instructs disciples to hate members of their own family (Luke 14:26), to act as if they were slaves (Matthew 20:27), and to sell their belongings and give to the poor (Luke 18:22). He restricts his mission (Matthew 10:6); he speaks of damnation (Matthew 8:12); and he calls Jews the devil's children (John 8:44).




In *The Difficult Words of Jesus*, New Testament scholar and Jewish leader Amy-Jill Levine shows how these difficult teachings would have sounded to the people who first heard them, how they have been understood over time, and how we might interpret them in the context of the Gospel of love and reconciliation.



FPC Endowment Funds Awarded

It is always exciting to announce the ways our FPC Endowment has been helping to advance the realm of God in the world around us. If you have been reading our newsletter columns, church bulletin announcements and listening to church worship service announcements, you have been quite aware that we have just completed our 2022 endowment distribution. Announced initially in February, all applications for endowment support were due by May 4. Maintaining an announced period to honor grant requests has greatly helped the endowment committee to address as many needs as possible with the funding we have available. Following the May deadline, the FPC Endowment Committee met and approved several grant requests for funds from church and local groups:

<u>Dodekah Ministry</u> – This FPC ministry is a 12-month program dedicated to team building, history learning, theological thinking and serving the community. It will culminate with a two-week international trip exploring the Scottish history of the Presbyterian Church. The Endowment Committee approved awarding \$1,000 to cover program expenses for every new person signing up for this program.

<u>Ordination Studies</u> – The Endowment Committee awarded \$1,750 for the cost of Anna Sheetz's final seminary class at the Dubuque Theological Seminary.

Domestic Violence Intervention Program Capital Campaign – The Endowment Committee approved DVIP's request for a \$25,000 pledge over three years to help them build a new shelter that will double their capacity to serve victim-survivors of abuse, human trafficking, and harassment. DVIP has served the lowa City community for over 30 years and over the past two years has seen a dramatic increase in requests for help. In May of 2022, their hotline calls increased by 28%. They are currently in their "silent" phase of fundraising, they plan to go public in the next six months and to break ground for their new facility in Spring of 2023.

<u>Discipleship, Leadership to Equip and Empower</u>
<u>African Churches Project</u> - Pastor Theogene
Havugimana has established a 501c3 organization,
Enihakole Ministries, to support African immigrants in
Eastern Iowa and communities in Africa. \$6,000 was
approved by the Endowment Committee to cover rent
in their Cedar Rapids location.

In future years, please watch for news of our endowment distribution, which will usually come in early spring. The necessary application forms are always online on the church website. If we find we have additional funding as the year moves on, we will have an additional funding period as well; however, one distribution period is now becoming standard for each year.

Thanks to all who have given in many ways to support the FPC Endowment. Truly, it is a joy to see this fund reach out to support God's work in our church, our community and our world.




Prayer Post


