BUT, in my brief time with you I have been very impressed by the warm welcome I have received, and, more importantly, by your dedication to being the Body of Christ in the Iowa City community and globally. KUDOS.

In the coming weeks I look forward to meeting you, but I must warn you, I am terrible with names. I have always been terrible with names, even in childhood. I blame this in part on the fact that my maternal aunts were named Lola, Maeola, and Viola. Throw in a Violet and I was constantly confused by my mother referring to “Aunt I,” “Aunt Mae,” “Aunt Vi,” and another “Aunt Vi”! What’s a little kid to do?!

On a more serious note, my exposure to FPC goes back to the days of Pastor Zerwas. He was a seminary classmate of my home pastor in Peoria. My wife, Sue, and I were part of a pastor lectionary study group hosted by David Fillpot. David preached my installation service at First Presbyterian Church in Williamsburg. Until his death, we enjoyed an occasional lunch together in either Black Mountain or Asheville, North Carolina.

I believe that as you prepare to write a new chapter in your life together as FPC that your best years are yet

to come. We live in a new era—a Covid era—and we will never be able to go back to the “fleshpots” of Egypt ... to a time before. Like the Early Church in the coming years we will learn to lean more heavily upon the guidance of the Holy Spirit and the Providential care of God.

In August, the Consultation of Religious Communities confirmed hosting its annual Warm Winter Wear Distribution (WWWD) on October 16–22. This event will be held in the new winter shelter at the far east end of the Guide Link Center, 340 Southgate Ave., Iowa City.

Please begin collecting clean items and keep them at home. From October 2–16, there will be marked collection boxes in Ryerson Hall for your donations. Our highest priority is: winter coats and jackets of all sizes, and other outerwear (snow pants, hats, gloves/mittens, winter scarves, warm socks and winter boots). We will also gladly accept sweaters, sweatshirts and sweatpants.



Like last year, we will be requiring both volunteers and shoppers to sign up via Sign-up Genius. Only seven family representatives will be permitted to shop during each half-hour, assisted by a volunteer. More information will be shared by the end of September. Please save the week of October 16–22, for volunteer opportunities as follows:

October 16 – set up and begin receiving donations (Sunday, noon–4 p.m.)

October 17 & 18 – continue to receive donations, sort items and set up (Monday and Tuesday, 9 a.m.–6 p.m.)

October 19–21 – distribution of clothing (Wednesday–Friday: 9 a.m.– 6:p.m.).

October 22 – distribution of clothing (Saturday, 9 a.m.–noon); Clean-up, noon to 4 p.m.

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family and Friends,

Six years ago when I returned to FPC to begin my ministry I used a passage from Isaiah as my guide and inspiration. Isaiah 43:19 says, "I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" That year, 2016, was a time of transition and change for the church—staff retiring, new staff coming in, changes to programming, strategic planning, and the kick-off of the capital campaign. There was a lot to be celebrated, a lot to be mourned, and a need for flexibility and open mindedness.

Does that sound familiar? Once again this church finds itself at an exciting new transitional moment—coming out of almost two full years of worshipping online only, searching for a new pastor, starting new programming, and discerning what the mission of this church is.

This is not goodbye as I hope to continue my long relationship with this church while allowing the space for a new person to transition into this position.

God is always creating and re-creating. New pastors, new babies, new vocations, new callings. My prayer for this church as I begin a new season in my life is that it can embrace a spirit of re-creation. Who is God calling us to be? Where is God calling us to serve? What is God calling us to create?

Thank you for allowing me to serve in ministry at First Presbyterian Church. It has been an honor and a blessing.

Tween/Mother Retreat October 14-15, 2022



Update from your FPC Free Lunch Team

A faithful group of about ten FPC family and friends has continued to serve a meal on the third Thursday of each month at the Iowa City Free Lunch Program on Gilbert Ct. When the pandemic started, the program's dining room was closed and all meals were served in takeout containers to folks who either walked or drove up to the kitchen. A few months ago the dining room reopened, giving guests the option of either taking a meal out with them or sitting at a table in the dining room. So far about half the meals are served in the dining room. Volunteers continue to serve from behind a plastic barrier for their safety.

FPC can be very proud of the meals that we're offering. In July it was smoked BBQ chicken sandwiches, roasted potatoes, stir-fried vegetables, a fresh fruit salad and raisin pound cake. In August we served our traditional August meal — BLT sandwiches, corn on the cob, stir-fried vegetables, fresh fruit and cookies. Both months we handed out 163 meals — that's a lot of bacon and chicken.

If you would like to be a part of this meaningful and fun community service project, please consider joining our team. No kitchen experience needed. We generally meet around 9:30 or 10:00 and finish up shortly after 1:00. Volunteers are welcome to participate for the entire time or just part of the time. Session Meeting Highlights of August 2022

The session met August 16, 2022 on Zoom. Acting administrator Nancy Gardner called the meeting to order and declared a quorum. Elder Doris Preucil offered devotions and prayer. Pastor Kyle Otterbein joined the meeting at 7:25 p.m. and served as moderator for the remainder of the meeting.

The Administration Committee offered a motion stating that, in accordance with First Presbyterian Church's desire to be environmentally conscious, non-disposable plates, glasses, cups silverware will be used during fellowship time beginning no later than the first Sunday in October, 2022. **The motion was approved.**

Endowment committee offered a motion to disburse \$67,011.80 from the First Presbyterian Church, Iowa City, Endowment Funds at Hills Bank and Trust instead of \$25,750.00 approved by Session July 18, 2022 and to disburse \$21,602.76 from First Presbyterian Church, Iowa City Endowment funds at US Bank. Session **approved the motion.**

Acting administrator Nancy Gardner reported that VBX had been a great success.

Pastor Nominating Committee member Jim Claypool gave an update on the progress in the search for a new pastor. Two candidates were in the interviewing process. Elder Jeremy Fletcher gave Session an update concerning the interim pastor. The Terms of Call have

been drafted and Pastor Kyle Otterbein helped with details of the contract for the interim pastor. Potential start date for Rev. Forrest (Frosty) Krummel, the interim pastor, is September 4, 2022.

Personnel Committee moderator Jeremy Fletcher summarized the changes made in the revised Personnel Committee's staffing recommendations. Session members discussed the changes. A motion to accept the staffing recommendation was tabled until the interim pastor is on site. Acting administrator Nancy Gardner will continue to serve through the transition to interim pastor Frosty Krummel.

On behalf of the Reconciliation Ministry, Elder Jane Cranston reported that the Friends of Pasrur had a successful meeting August 16, 2022 and completed mailing letters to donors to the Pasrur school in Pakistan.

Acting administrator Nancy Gardner reported that home communion was again taking place.

Elder Lara Marsh closed the meeting with prayer.



Do you remember the story of the destitute old lady who dropped her last coin in the offering plate? Or the young man who had kept all of the Ten Commandments and asked Jesus what else to do? Jesus told him that to be perfect he must sell all his possessions and give the money to the poor. The man elected to stop short of perfect and left.

It probably isn't practical to give all you have to the poor; then you would become one of the poor. But the request to tithe, i.e. donate 10% of your income, is reasonable for many. Or, alternatively, picking the largest percentage you can to donate is desirable. There is more to being a good Christian than giving money, but it shows where your heart is, and it's a good start.

Sign in to My First Pres

1. Go to FPC website, <https://firstpreswacivcity.org/>, scroll down to the **My First Pres box**
2. Click on "Need a Login? Click Here"
3. You will be asked to enter your first name, last name and email. Enter this info and click "Find Me"
4. You should see a note congratulating you on setting up your account.
5. Once you see that note, check your email for your username and temporary password
6. You will be able to change password once you login
7. You should open up to the HOME screen; look at MY COMPLETE PROFILE for your personal information, PLEASE make sure your address and phone numbers are correct, feel free to make any changes needed. Note: changes are verified and may take 24 hours to show up. You can also sign up for online giving, pledging and see your yearly giving.

This is where it gets handy ... Now that you have **My First Pres** set up, you have the option to download the **Church Life** app to your phone or tablet! **Church Life** keeps you organized by allowing you to see calendar events, locate your friends' contact info (church directory at your finger tips); text, email and call plus get directions to map visits all on the go. You can keep track of your pledge and gifts to FPC, too.




